Greetings to you in our Lord Jesus Christ and His Immaculate Mother!

Our Holy Father, Pope Francis' recent visit to the USA and his divinely inspired words regarding the family inspires us all to look beyond ourselves. Family members come in all shapes and sizes, young, old, tall, short, diverse, identical, outgoing, introvert-



ed and as our Holy Father reminds us, each is a critical member to be loved, cherished, nurtured and protected. It is not always easy, but he encourages us to strengthen the family and there by strengthen our Holy Church.

St. Benedict Parish is a spiritual family, gathered around our Father's table and engulfed by His love and care. We cannot comprehend the level of love He offers us as our Father, if we but open our hearts to His words and try earnestly to live according to His example. He has blessed our St. Benedict family in so many ways this last year including: the addition of 152 families, so we now have a total individual count of 2161; our Religious Education program expanded to two days a week with participants exceeding 300; our First Communion celebrations have extended to two ceremonies to accommodate the attendees; we have added an additional weekend Mass; our Columbarium is adding an additional 64 niches because the other 80 are no longer available. In addition, through private donations we have been able to build a storage facility to free up space in our church while providing other opportunities for maintenance of our grounds and facilities. I also want to extend a deep word of appreciation for one of our Scouts who is receiving his Eagle status by building a beautiful Stations of the Cross pathway that will be placed in the Columbarium prayer garden.



A Year in Review



OPERATING COMMENTS:

For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015, our weekly offertory and holy day collections provided 89% of total revenue. The \$797,012 collected in offertory combined with Religious Education fees, designated offerings and other income enabled us to meet our expenses of \$871,002 to end the year with a net operating surplus of \$22,807. Our goal for the current fiscal year is to collect offertory in amounts sufficient to cover all operating expenses. This can be accomplished as we pray and share as a parish family.

Administrative salaries and benefits account for 46.4% of expenses. This includes salary, health insurance and retirement benefits for staff and clergy. Administrative salaries and benefits are 38% of expenses and clergy salary and benefits are 8.6% of expenses. The Diocese of Charleston sets the compensation for the clergy. Ideally, we would like to be at 40% of total expenses.

As you plan for the year ahead, we encourage you to reflect carefully on what you are able to give to support St. Benedict and its ministries. We also ask you to consider enrolling in our online giving program. This helps provide a consistent revenue stream and alleviates declines in the weekly offertory associated with natural disasters, holidays and vacations.

Parish Survey Question #13—Were you aware that St. Benedict is in its first year of a Capital Campaign in order to meet our current mortgage and make progress toward reducing our remaining debt?

Although many of you are aware that we are in the midst of a building campaign 10% of you were not and 35% of you have not yet contributed to it.

If you have joined our parish in the last several years or are not currently giving to the With All Your Heart building fund, please consider sharing in the responsibility to help fund our campus and Church. In our recent survey, some parishioners responded that they would contribute to the building fund, but were never asked to participate. Now we are asking, and would like your decision to be made with a spirit of joy and love in your heart. Giving this way, I know you will be truly blessed by your generosity.

The idea is a "Take Jesus to Dinner" concept of giving by donating an additional \$25 each week specifically to the building fund. If 250 families responded in this way, we would cover our \$25,000 monthly mortgage payment. Currently we pay \$135,000 per year in interest, which limits our ability to expand our ministries. Of course, you may be in position to give more, or less, but giving something every week makes it possible for you to give a large amount – a little at a time. We strongly encourage you to participate by using our Online Giving Program, which makes it even easier to give.

Will you join us in our Take Jesus to Dinner Club for \$25 per week or decide what works best for you? Your commitment to be a part of this growing and faithfully generous family is what matters most.
